boldly as "living streams in the heart of the Church" so to rejuvenate and transform it, making it "lively, re-energized, refreshed, reawakened and restored" as does a river to a landscape. Then, "The wilderness and the parched land will exult; the Arabah will rejoice and bloom; Like the crocus it shall bloom abundantly, and rejoice with joyful song." *Isaiah* 35:1-2

At the heart of our mission are five R's to rev up the power of Christ's renewal. The first, Remain: "Remain in My love." We must stand devoted to Christ's beloved Bride, the Church, through better or worse, entrusting her flaws to His salvific and unifying mercy. We must pardon all offenses, heal division, repent for all wrongdoing, model unity, and endure in love. The second, **Rediscover**: We must help others rediscover their true identity as "people of Pentecost," to unlock the power of the Spirit that IS DYNAMITE and life-changing. Then, ignited by this uncontainable joy, many shall leap into the deep places of Christ's love, like Peter leapt into the sea upon beholding the holy resurrected Christ. The third. **Restore**: We must restore the beatific vision to the heart of our identity as the Church, as adoring worshipers of Christ as seen by John in the Book of Revelation. God calls us to magnify the praise of the cherubim, who offer unceasing praise to God, "so that we might exist for the praise of His glory." Eph 1:12 Let us reach out and draw everyone to His upper room of praise! The forth, **Reinvest**: We must step up with our many splendid and varied gifts to be Christ's nets of the New Evangelization, to draw many more souls into His deep love. Be ready with new "zeal and in earnest endeavor: be aglow and burning with the Spirit, serving the Lord!" Romans 12:11 The fifth, Reclaim: With holy urgency, we must reach out to lukewarm souls to lay claim as heirs to "every spiritual blessing in the heavens," Eph 1:3, poured out for them in the splendor and grandeur of the Holy Spirit. Pope Francis has commissioned us to host Life in The Spirit Seminars in every parish all year long.

My sisters and brothers, it is Pentecost harvest time! Let us go together and steward the bountiful gifts we have received in Christ, gathering them from under bushels and buried in forgotten fields, leading Christ's Church to the summit of faith where graces cascade and all things are made new.

### Five R's: Remain, Rediscover, Restore, Reinvest, Reclaim

Kelley attended the week-long Leadership Training Course (LTC) offered in April at the Archbishop Brunett Retreat Center at The Palisades. It was presented by Jim Murphy, Michelle Moran, and Andres Arango, leaders in the International Catholic Charismatic Renewal (ICCRS). There were 30 local students and 75 total participants from around the U.S. and Canada.

My brothers and sisters, I greet you in the complete JOY of the Risen Christ. Attending the ICCRS Training Conference was a great "mountaintop" grace, gathering with servant leaders from throughout the nation, to receive transfiguring vison, zeal and expressions for the New Evangelization.

It was a delight to learn that our beloved Pope Francis, while he was in Argentina, once participated with the same ICCRS training team that was teaching us. The Holy Father models our call to rise up and lead as missionary disciples by living, proclaiming and sharing the joy of the Gospel.
