The Lord Has More for Us

from the Pentecost 2020 Live Streamed event Fr. Cal Christiansen, Keynote Speaker

Fr. Cal Christiansen greeted us with a blessing on Pentecost Sunday, the end of a journey that began on Ash Wednesday. It has been a different journey this year. He invited viewers to extend their hands and pray that the Holy Spirit would anoint this time, "Come Holy Spirit. Enter the hearts of everyone viewing, be here with us today." He said he believed that the Lord wants more for us personally, for our families and for our Church.

Fr. Cal read from a commentary on the Acts of the Apostles, written by a twelve-year-old, who said that the disciples had been waiting in Jerusalem as Jesus told them. It was like the Hebrews wandering in the desert before entering the promised land. They were going through what we are going through now, in this time of a pandemic. It is a time of waiting for something more. Our promised land is coming but we have to wait for it. There is something more on the horizon.

The first Wednesday when everything was closed down because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Fr. Cal really felt the emptiness in contrast to the usually very busy day. This Lent was a real desert experience for him. But the moments of grace were times to go more deeply into Jesus and his cross. God is always moving us to something more.

He said that biblical passages sustained him: Romans 8:28, "We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." God has a final plan for the cosmos, and for us personally. He is a personal God. He loves you. We are destined for greatness. Do you believe this? Do you believe that we can have the first fruits now?

Ephesians 1:13-14, "In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of his glory." We have the first installment of the Holy Spirit. In Christ we have been given the gift of the Spirit. It is the first installment of something more. As the Hebrews were going through the desert, as the disciples were waiting for the Advocate, there is always more. All things work together for good, and we have the first installment of something more.

He asked, "Do you believe that our Lord has a plan for your life? No

Woody Allen once said, "Eighty percent of success is showing up." How true. It seems, the longer I allow the Holy Spirit to take over my life the less I must do. Regarding the Holy Spirit, I have come to believe that just showing up is closer to ninetyfive percent.

If it were not for my prior encounters, I would have never volunteered for this mission. The call came on April 16th asking if I would help with the Pentecost Live Streaming Event. I thought to myself, "Isn't Pentecost on May 31st, six weeks away?" I asked the Holy Spirit, "What are you getting us into now?" He said, "Just send the invite and I will do the rest."

He had never let me down before, so I agreed, and we were off. Yes, we. The Holy Spirit introduced me to new friends and old ones that I knew would answer the call because they believe in the same insane concept that if we allow the Holy Spirit to work through us there is nothing we can't do.

What was the big deal anyway? We had never done this before, with equipment we didn't have, during a pandemic, leaving us with limited locations and people to recruit. No big deal.

It's during experiences like this that I understand more fully why God assigned 12 Apostles to Jesus.

It was because that is how many it took. Somehow the Father knows the perfect recipe of skills, talent, ability, gifts, etc. to balance out the energy for staying on task. Personality traits, defects of character coupled with humility and gratitude that created this harmonious team.

Each team member had a talent and background that was required to be successful and not one stepped on any toes. Not one was dependent on praise in order to stay focused. It was as if each team member was working perfectly, as if their life depended on it, to fulfill their independent role; and the Holy Spirit put it all together like a jigsaw puzzle. It truly was amazing to behold.

I have plenty of examples throughout this experience that I could share, but all you really need to do is watch the video and know that nobody other than the Holy Spirit knew what they were doing.

Suffice it to say that in the end all I really did was "show up."

I've been associated with WWCCR in various different capacities. So when I received a call from WWCCR to help the live streaming team to execute the event for Pentecost, I went ahead and said Yes. I'm no sound engineer by any standards, and had no idea how to pull this off. I had somewhat of a knowledge of live streaming, but this one was at a completely different level. There were many moments where the Holy Spirit came to our aid. But the biggest one revolved around a device called the "video switcher." This device allows hooking up multiple cameras, and pick any one of them for the live stream. It sits at the heart of the overall system.

Getting it to work was a nightmare. After investing considerable amount of money and effort scouring various forums, I found it needed one more device to make it work. So I went ahead and ordered it. After trying to put them together unsuccessfully, I found it needed yet another device! Frustrated, I went and ordered that too. At this point I had invested enough time, money and effort, so I told the Lord that this would be my last attempt before giving up. The device arrived, and guess what? It still did not work!

Angry at the Lord at how this had ended, I gave up on it and packed all the devices to return when I heard a voice say "Restart the system and try again." I felt it was the Holy Spirit speaking. So I listened, and as a last ditch attempt did just that and voila—it worked! Praise the Lord! The settings probably just needed a clean start.

I was thrilled to finally see this through after all that battle! The live-stream event went off as originally planned, with multiple cameras producing an engaging experience. Thank you Jesus!

We ask you to heal those addictions to pornography, substance abuse, to materialism, to ourselves, to our pride. Whatever is blocking your full presence in our lives, we ask for healing of that now. Strengthen us, be with us, that we may be faithful missionary disciples. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of each of us. Through Christ our Lord. Amen"

Pentecost 2020 Testimony The Spirit IS My Life

On April 21, 2020, my dearest Nana, Colleen Stuber, returned to our Lord. Just two weeks earlier, she was diagnosed with COVID-19 and taken to the hospital. In the span of those two short weeks, the Coronavirus attacked her organs, leading to a heart attack, kidney failure, lung issues, and pneumonia. She was placed on a ventilator in the ICU and was closely monitored by the incredible hospital staff, yet, the virus wouldn't back down.

Her rate of decline was very fast so fast that we didn't even have time to process all that was happening. It was like, one moment, my Nana was showing me her new art projects over Facetime and updating me on the newest drama in her assisted living home, and the next moment, she was hooked up to a breathing tube and several machines, unable to communicate with her family.

One of the most difficult parts of this suffering was not being able to be physically there with my Nana, holding her hand, and whispering in her ear that she was going to be all right. It absolutely broke my heart. The amazing hospital staff set up a station for us to video chat with her when she was in the ICU, although, she wasn't able to speak or respond. But we still talked to her each day, prayed out loud, and looked at her beautiful face. I even sung the song I wrote for her when I was in 4th grade during every one of our video chats. Those were the only source of physical connection and encounter that I could have with my grandma during her final days on earth.

Coping with the loss of a loved one is something I was never prepared for. While my Nana was in the hospital, I was mad, afraid, scared, sad, and heartbroken. I would sprint around my neighborhood block, time and time again, just trying to make sense of the situation. I scribbled in my journal and unleashed all my sadness. I held my family members as they were hurting. I even sent text messages to my Nana, knowing that she wouldn't be able to respond, but just wanting to share all that was on my heart. I looked at her artwork and letters, which were hung in my room-all the handmade gifts she gave me throughout the years-and was left in tears. I felt like a part of my heart and soul was dying with my Nana, as her health weakened. And for a moment, nothing else in all the world mattered to me.

In these moments of suffering, although my whole world felt like it was shattering beneath me, I was being held. Calling upon the Holy Spirit in my daily life allowed me to experience the peace of Christ, even among the pain, especially among the pain, so that my tears were not just ones of sorrow and anger, but ones of joy and love. Because I know that in our suffering we unite to Christ on the cross most intimately, I also know with all my heart that my Nana was deeply united to the Heart of Christ during her final days.

"Not my will, but your will be done, Lord." The Holy Spirit showered me with graces to see the light, to be reaffirmed and assured of the truth of Christ. I prayed every day for the miraculous healing of my Nana that she would be delivered from this virus, and brought safely to shore. Our Lord granted me this wish, but in a different way than I expected, on April 21, 2020 at 10:08 pm, which is when my Nana took her very last breath on earth, and her very first breath in Heaven.

My faith didn't take away my sorrows and sufferings, but instead, brought meaning and redemption to these pains. Somehow, entrusting my life to the Holy Spirit, allowed me to be in tune with the will of God for my Nana. It allowed me to walk through one of the most difficult moments in my life with peace. And even among the various emotions and ways that I processed, there was never a moment that the peace of the Spirit left me. It is only with my faith that I was able to make it through and look to the light, when it once seemed impossible to find. Not only that, but to rejoice and celebrate the gift of my grandma's life on earth and new life in heaven, knowing that her eternal journey had just begun.

The Holy Spirit isn't just a part of my life. The Spirit IS my life. The Spirit consumes every one of my breaths and leads me closer to the truth of our faith. The Holy Spirit comforts me in my deepest trials and rejoices with me in my greatest joys.

I invite you, wherever you are at this moment, to pause, reflect on your current state in life, bring to mind the sufferings, pains, joys, and blessings, and unite these to the Holy Spirit, who is right beside you; who is in you. This is the moment—this is the time to renew our faith, together, as one community and Body of Christ. You are not alone. You are being held. You will get through this. You are infinitely loved. So, let us pray, "Come, Holy Spirit, come."
