# Bananas and the Gift of **Prophetic Joke-Telling**

About six years ago, at a moment of great trial in my life, I suddenly became aware of God's nearness to me. I was coping with the death of my wife, Theresa, and I noticed how the circumstances around the time of her death were filled with supernatural "coincidences" that carried me through my grief in a way that filled me with an unexpected peace. In fact, I began to have the distinct awareness that God was very close, speaking DIRECTLY to me about trusting Him and being at peace in His embrace.

He began to identify His voice for me through a series of "triple events." I would notice a "coincidence," such as hearing a song or a Scripture passage, in two unlikely places within hours of each other. Then, just when I was about to dismiss it as a coincidence, I would hear or read it a third time, with a distinct message attached. For example, I began hearing the song, "Be Still My Soul" at very meaningful times and places, which left little doubt that it was aimed directly at me.

God was reminding me that He loved me and that He was

orchestrating events all around me. When I realized that He was speaking directly to me, I could hardly believe it. I'd always believed that "God's voice" was broadly addressed to all believers at once; through Scripture or preaching. I was a "follower" of Jesus, a disciple, like those who followed him at a distance among the crowds of Galilee. But suddenly He was speaking to me as if He and I were alone together! And He must be listening to my prayer in a very personal way, too.

One day, in my car, I remember feeling His presence with me and knew He was listening. And because my life had been completely upended by Theresa's death, I cried out: "Lord! Tell me the plan! You keep telling me to be still and be at peace. Why don't you tell me your plan for my life? What should I do now?" I was astonished by how quickly and lovingly He answered that prayer.

Instantly, a bizarre memory jumped into my head. I recalled a time, more than 30 years before, when my dad was telling a joke. It was a joke that I'd long forgotten but



Let us proclaim with jubilation the majesty and power of God!

Are you aware that we have entered into the Jubilee Year for the Charismatic Renewal in the Catholic Church? Fifty years ago, on the weekend of February 17-19, students on retreat at The Ark and The Dove in Gibsonia, Pennsylvania, were studying the Acts of the Apostles. They desired the power of God in their lives and prayed, asking God to pour out His Spirit upon them as He did for the Apostles in the upper room. And the rest, as they say, is history. There is a new Golden Jubilee Edition of the book *As By a New Pentecost* by Patti Gallagher Mansfield about the students, their stories and how that event shaped their lives. It is available in our bookstore.

To understand the salvation history of Jubilee, I invite you to read Leviticus 25 and Nehemiah 8; two different reasons to celebrate a year of Jubilee. Both are beneficial for us and give glory to God. In Leviticus, the Lord God instructed the people to observe a holy year of resting, reflecting on their sinfulness, seeking the forgiveness of God and forgiving one another, remembering the faithfulness of God and the freedom He brings to all His people. In Nehemiah, Jubilee was

a time of celebrating with jubilation all that God has done for His people. For example, after God parted the Red Sea to save the Israelites they celebrated for three days.

To Jubilate is to express great joy, to rejoice, to celebrate or to raise a shout of joy! St Augustine described it this way: "Joy that cannot be expressed in words. Yet the voice expresses what is conceived in the heart and cannot be explained in words. This is jubilation." Sounds like speaking in tongues to me. According to Eddie Ensley in Sounds of Wonder, "jubilation played a very real role in group worship and prayer; for hundreds of years it was a standard part of the Mass. The jubilation came after the singing of the alleluia, just before the Gospel during Mass... the people moved into exuberant wordless singing on vowel sounds. This jubilation could last for up to five minutes." This gave me great joy to read these words!

On April 1, we are going to gather for a Night of Worship in praise of our good God. Several different groups will be leading us. It will be a great opportunity to be jubilant, even in the middle of Lent! We will be dedicating the next issue of GLEANINGS to the subject of Jubilee so get excited and join us on April 1st at Immaculate Conception Church in Seattle from 7-10 PM (see ad on page 6).

WWCCR will be celebrating our 40th Anniversary in November. It is not only the 50th year of Charismatic Renewal in the Catholic Church, it is year one of the next 50 years. Let us pray: "Through the intercession of Jesus, Mary and Joseph may we fully embrace the many facets of this year of Jubilee. Amen."

now was hearing him tell again: "A guy walks into a bar and orders a drink. Then he notices another customer at the bar who has bananas sticking out of his ears." My dad's face was playful as he continued telling one of his favorite jokes: "He asks the bartender why the other guy has bananas in his ears and the bartender says: 'I don't know. He comes in here all the time. Maybe you should ask him.' So the first fellow walks over to the other customer and says to him: 'Hey! You!' After a while, the guy with the bananas looks up, straining to hear. 'Huh?' So the first guy yells back: 'Hey, do you know you have bananas in your ears?' The guy with the bananas strains his face and cups his hand to his ears and yells back: 'Sorry, I can't hear you. You have to speak up. I've got these bananas in my ears."'

At that moment, God imparted His two-part answer to me through the voice of my own dad telling one of his awful jokes. Message number one was: "When you can't hear me speak to you, it's NOT because I'm not speaking, or not speaking loudly or clearly enough. I've been speaking to you all the time, but you have bananas in your ears!" And His second, gentle but emphatic, message to me — His divine punch line: "Don't be concerned about knowing My plan. I am your loving Father and what is most important is that we share an intimate relationship with each other."

At this point, I was crying so uncontrollably that I was struggling to keep my car in its lane on the freeway. It was now TOO abundantly clear that the soft "voice" I had been hearing in my heart was VERY real and personal. I was overcome with awe and amazement that the almighty Creator would seek me out for a one-on-one "conversational" relationship.

Until then, I didn't know this was possible for someone like me. For saints maybe, but not me. Not only was this possible, I had to conclude that He wants that kind of intimate relationship with each of us. But as I talked to people about this, most people did not seem to understand. But some others DID know. People I knew in prophetic and healing ministry at WWCCR knew exactly what I was talking about. They "normalized" this for me. They spoke of it as "prophetic" in the sense of hearing God speaking in the here-and-now.

In his book, *The Gift of Prophecy*, Fr. Robert DeGrandis writes: "The Lord wants to speak to us today

and He is going to speak to us today. The Lord wants to communicate to each individual His love and what He has for them. Why should He not communicate what He is thinking at the time, if we but ask? Indeed, prophecy is the gift of the Spirit to reveal the mind of God, the depths of God here and now (1 Cor. 2:10). This is prophecy. And it is for all."

Prophecy for everyone? Really? Digging into this idea a little more, I learned that all Christians receive a prophetic anointing at baptism and that, like many of the sacramental anointings, it is empowered by baptism in the Holy Spirit. Prophecy is one of the primary charisms the Spirit bestows.

St. Paul ranks prophecy as the most important of the charisms:

- "Pursue love, but strive eagerly for the spiritual gifts, above all that you may prophesy." (1 Cor. 14:1).
- "And so my brothers and sisters, strive eagerly to prophesy" (1 Cor. 14:39).

The gift of prophecy is obviously very important to our walk as Christians, but it is mysterious. It boggles the mind to contemplate God speaking to us individually to build up His Body. It defies our natural understanding and so it is often clouded in suspicion. But Paul asks us to seek after it, and that means prayer and study to better understand how to seek it and use it properly. And we can begin now.

Beginning in March, we are blessed that WWCCR is providing a 12-week course on the prophetic anointing and prophecy (*see calendar insert*). By participating in this course, we seek to move further into that intimate, one-on-one, conversational relationship with our loving Father. And though we seek his gifts, our true goal is intimacy with him – the relationship with the giver should be the desire of our hearts. By being open to his love, he will help us get the bananas out of our ears, so we can hear his voice more clearly. I hope to see many of you at the upcoming Prophecy course.





## **School of Prayer Ministry**

In the past I have been asked the question, "Why do you need a class to teach people how to pray?"

My answer is simple. Deep down inside, everyone really already knows how to pray. We are simply offering insights as to how to minister, through prayer, to those we encounter. For lack of a better term, there are different "styles" of prayer that are available to the prayer minister. The School of Prayer Ministry is offering additional "tools" to help the prayer teams connect with those they are praying for.

The School of Prayer Ministry is a year-long commitment, with classes on the third (and fifth) Saturdays of the month. It is a full day, from nine o'clock in the morning to five o'clock in the afternoon. A typical class day consists of praise and worship/prayer time, introduction presentations by SPM team members, and viewing a DVD followed by general discussion of the materials presented. During the class day, students and facilitators break into small groups to pray and practice what they have been discussing.

While attending the School of Prayer Ministry, students are exposed to a variety of topics with over 45 lessons presented. Some of the topics include: praying for physical, inner, and generational healing; healing in marriage and divorce; abortion and miscarriage; suffering, depression and mental illness; post-traumatic stress disorder; spiritual warfare and deliverance ministry; spiritual, sexual, physical and emotional abuse; and hearing God and praying with authority.

There is a mini Life in the Spirit Seminar presented and Mass is celebrated three times, once each level. Classes will be held at:
