

I am not certain when I was first introduced to WWCCR, but it is a pleasure to have been associated with them for many years. Although I never attended



#### Dear Friends,

I attended my first prayer group at St. Luke's when I was 15, in 1973. It seemed to be a normal part of what it meant to be Catholic. None of the spiritual gifts seemed unusual to me for I had an experience of the Holy Spirit that I later



learned was the baptism of the Holy Spirit when I was 14 and preparing for Confirmation.

Our teachers for Confirmation were all involved in the charismatic prayer group. The class was in many ways a Life in the Spirit seminar. We were told to expect the manifestation of the Holy Spirit and the spiritual gifts. One night, I was praying when I felt myself overwhelmed by the Holy Spirit. I felt myself floating and enveloped in an experience of love that I never experienced so deeply before or since. My whole life flashed before me, not just my past, but also my future. The Lord showed me a path He desired me to follow and He told me not to be afraid. I was wrapped in this state for what seemed to be hours. I really do not know how long it lasted. Later that month I was confirmed and I knew the path I needed to follow. So, when I was invited to our local prayer group, it seemed like home to me.

Over the years I attended many prayer groups, both locally and in Maryland and Washington D.C. while attending seminary. In recent years I have not been as active in the Renewal as I used to be but I still use the spiritual gifts in my ministry. The gifts of healing and words of knowledge and wisdom have been an important part of my ministry. I especially love leading praise. At the Snohomish County jail every Saturday we have 45 minutes of praise and worship for the prisoners for the men in the morning and for the women in the afternoon. I love this time of praising the Lord. My ministry and call to the priesthood came out of the Renewal. I am very grateful. Praise the Lord!



# **Celebrating a Charismatic Jubilee**

A Fresh Look at Charismatic Renewal and the Charismatic Dimension of the Church by Fr. Bob Hogan BBD © 2016; National Service Committee of the Catholic Charismatic Renewal





Fr. Bob Hogan is the co-founder of the Brothers of the Beloved Disciple Community and the Director of the Catholic Center for Charismatic Renewal in San Antonio. He will thoughtfully walk you through the Charismatic Renewal events that bring us to today's Renewal. Throughout the book, he also skillfully weaves in key quotes from the Popes, Scripture, and other Renewal founders.

Fr. Bob covers a lot of material in these 140 pages. He addresses how the hierarchical and charismatic dimensions of the Church are co-essential. He does a beautiful job of describing the beginnings of CCR, from the Duquesne Weekend to how things progressed during its rapid growth and how we got to where we are today, 50 years later. I appreciated his clear description about the "Full Role of the Holy Spirit" that leads to: first, experiencing a deeper union with God; second, an inner transformation that leads to holiness; third, a ministry empowered by charisms for evangelization and service; and fourth, building communities that witness to a renewed Catholic life (as described in the National Service Committee mission statement). He

addresses the struggles of Charismatic Renewal leadership and ministries head-on and provides some wisdom on how to move forward. Fr. Bob also gives a clearer understanding of baptism in the Holy Spirit, the use of charisms, and the important role of praise and worship in communities and daily life. In his last chapter, he celebrates with Mary, the model and teacher of charismatic living.

Whether you are new to Charismatic Renewal or have been involved for years, you'll be able to find new insights and a clearer understanding about the Holy Spirit and Catholic Charismatic Renewal from this book.

# Never Give Up! The Fruit of Patience and Prayer

At first sight, there is nothing in the small church of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Kelso, Washington, to draw one in save the Blessed Sacrament, the crucifix, and a beautiful statue of the Immaculate Heart. All else is bare. Still, this little parish of only several hundred families has become a place of love and healing for the many that come.

My husband Dan and I arrived in Kelso from Ohio in May 2005 and began attending IHM. There were no charismatic prayer groups there or anywhere close by. Unbeknown to us, two other couples and one other woman also moved to the area at the same time and begin attending IHM. When one of the couples announced the start of a prayer group, we all showed up, excited to have a group to gather with. Everyone felt that they had been called by God, not only to this particular area, but also to start a prayer group.

We met weekly for the next five years, getting to know each other, praising and thanking God, praying, teaching, inviting others and waiting for what we felt God had for us. Our leader, Jack, kept saying, "God has a purpose for this and something is about to happen! We have to be patient." However, NOTHING happened. No encouragement from our leaders or others. No sign that we were on the right track, or even a good track! We attempted a day of renewal to give testimony to life in the Spirit, encourage baptism in the Holy Spirit and invite our parishioners to experience the Risen Lord. About 10 people showed up. It was a graced-filled day with many blessings, but, a week later, it seemed as though it never happened. We were stumped. And it seemed that this was the way it was with every activity that took place.

But on Divine Mercy Sunday 2009, our prayer group met for the 3 PM celebration, and spontaneously gathered afterwards in the middle of the aisle to pray. At this time we sensed God's plan was about to unfold!

That next year, we gave a Life in the Spirit Seminar. 45 people attended and many were filled with the Holy Spirit! Our group grew and our pastor invited us to form prayer teams that would help with in-depth prayer for healing in our area. About 24 people from IHM, St. Mary's in Castle Rock and St. Rose in Longview were invited to attend School of Healing Prayer. Out of this program and the Unbound seminar, our parish prayer team ministry was born. In 2010, we formed our present ANAWIM Prayer Group and later started the Fount of Mercy Healing Mass that is scheduled four times a year. There are countless stories of healing, renewal, deliverance, and new life!

Since then, the ANAWIM parish prayer teams have prayed for countless people at healing Masses, after-Mass prayer on Sundays, and at in-depth scheduled prayer ministry. We've hosted Pentecost Vigils, Wild Goose is Loose series showings, weekly prayer meetings, several Life in the Spirit seminars, and two Unbound training programs.

We encourage those who are seeking renewal in their parish to never give up, to trust in prayer and to believe the desire in their hearts that God wants to renew us in this day! Happy 50 years of Charismatic Renewal, Church, and happy 40th Anniversary, WWCCR!


