

What an amazing way to begin the Pentecost Novena! Participants gathered from all over western Washington, and some even came from eastern Washington, to prepare for Pentecost with a journey into the Upper Room.



experience of "witnessing Pentecost" in the Upper Room in Jerusalem. Jim Murphy continued this theme by breaking open Acts 1 and 2, and explaining



the feast of Pentecost in the Old Testament and what it meant in Jesus' day. He shared how the "hero" of Acts is the Body of Christ, the Church, but the power behind the hero is the Holy Spirit. At the end of the evening we were invited to ponder in our hearts what it means to be in the upper room. We closed by praying Day One of the Pentecost Novena.

Saturday morning, we prayed Day Two of the Pentecost Novena and continued our theme with Sister Lucy Lukasiewicz challenging us, with humor, to be united both in prayer and as community. She said that you build community with love, there is fellowship in the Spirit, and that we are united by the same faith in God. Love is the key to unity. We were warned that the two enemies of unity are miscommunication and envy. We must listen more carefully to one another and to the Holy Spirit. We ended the afternoon with prayer ministry.

Saturday evening Jim Murphy called us to a "heart renewal," to have

courage to go forth, regain our first love, and use the charisms for the purpose they have been given, to build up the Body of Christ. We ended the day with a time of empowerment and prayer!

All the teachings were so rich, it will be good to listen over and over again (they can be ordered on page 3). May each one of us take the Upper Room into the world to share the grace of Pentecost with all those we meet! *Come, Holy Spirit!*

From Sue's Desk


Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

I pray you are enjoying the long days of glorious sunlight that summer brings. During the Easter Season, I especially enjoyed listening and reading the Gospel of John, which is so rich in love and is communicated so beautifully. Each day the Gospel readings at Mass lead us into the mystery of God's intimate love. It is a great reminder to explore the Gospel of John throughout the year. In John 16:12-13, Jesus said to his disciples: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming." When I read this verse I think of how the Holy Spirit speaks to us today through the gift of prophecy in our Church, our prayer groups, at our events, and in our personal prayer. The Holy Spirit speaks through the Pope, the Church and His people. The Spirit of truth is still declaring the things that are coming and the word that God wants to speak to our hearts today through the gift of prophecy.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit, including the gift of prophecy, are fostered by WWCCR, in the context of prayer groups, our events, and through the ministry of Dwelling Place. The purpose of prophecy is to build up the Body of Christ to keep the unity of with words of love and encouragement, and even sometimes correction. Often a prophetic word is proclaimed through the

scripture. In our "United in the Upper Room" celebration there was a prophetic word shared from Isaiah 55:1-11. There is not room to share the entire scripture, but here are the last two verses: "For just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to him who sows and bread to him who eats, so shall my word be that comes forth from my mouth; it shall not return to me void, but shall achieve the end for which I sent it." You will be blessed to read the entire text.

Let us all listen to Jesus, in our prayer times and in our groups, to the call He places in our hearts. Just think of what we could accomplish together; one body in Christ, spreading the joy



of the Gospel through the power of the Holy Spirit. I remind you again, 2015 has been designated nationally* for the Catholic Charismatic Renewal as the "Year of Unity." (see page 8) We hear the Spirit calling us to be one in Spirit. If there is any division or unresolved conflicts among us, we need to reconcile. We

need to repent and come together in peace.

"Well done, good and faithful servant!" (Matt 25:23) By Virginia King

In last month's GLEANINGS we announced the retirement of our Healing Mass Coordinator, Bobbie Brown. We asked former WWCCR Executive Director Virginia King to help us honor Bobbie in this issue. We also had the opportunity to honor her at the "United in the Upper Room" preparing for Pentecost event.

I ask you to join your prayers and gratitude with mine on the occasion of Bobbie Brown's retirement from WWCCR. It was my privilege to serve alongside Bobbie for most of the 15 years that she labored with love as the WWCCR Healing Mass Coordinator. Initially this was a

paid position but, when the poor economy forced budget cuts about eight years ago,Bobbie decided that she would continue in the same capacity but without pay. This is just one small example of the level of commitment and dedication that Bobbie brought to this job.

Bobbie is a person of great faith, hope and love. One of the things that inspires me most about her is that she is single-hearted. "Teach me, Lord, your way that I may walk in your truth, single-hearted and revering your name. I will praise you with all my heart, glorify your name forever, Lord my God." Psalm 86:11-12 It has always been obvious to me, in all her words and actions, that Bobbie loves the Lord and seeks to please Him at all times.

Bobbie has a gentle spirit, which at the same time is very strong. I'm sure that Bobbie would agree that she relied on the strength of the Holy Spirit as she gently and humbly served the Lord over these many years. "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of God." Matthew 5:3 It was a great joy to spend many hours on the road, traveling with Bobbie to parishes all over the Archdiocese, to probably 300 Healing Masses that WWCCR sponsored during her tenure. It was inspiring to watch the loving care with which Bobbie interacted with

> the various priests, parish contact people and prayer teams, in order to provide c o m p a s s i o n a t e attention to each person who came to these Masses seeking healing for themselves or their loved ones.

To most people,

planning the Healing Masses might seem like a simple undertaking. But really it takes several months of detailed planning for each Mass - and Bobbie planned about 20 Masses each year! She learned many skills and exercised many charisms in the course of fulfilling her responsibilities. She was constantly juggling multiple tasks - everything from contacting priests to recruiting prayer teams, from drafting bulletin announcements to writing thank-you notes, and dozens of other things-all with an abundance of graciousness, flexibility, perseverance and good humor.

In addition to honoring Bobbie, I would also like to honor her husband, Bob, who generously supported and encouraged Bobbie's involvement in the Healing Masses over these many years. The spouses that aren't as visible at WWCCR events are nevertheless a vital part of this ministry. Bob Brown willingly sacrificed a lot in order that Bobbie could dedicate so much of her time, energy and attention to this important work.

I estimate that over the years, Bobbie's caring oversight of the Healing Masses touched the lives of more than 30,000 people. I thank God for her and I pray that the ministry that flourished so well under her compassionate heart will continue to bear fruit as Debora Johnston carries it forward.

Bobbie will still be "in the picture" even as she steps away from the full responsibilities of being Healing Mass Coordinator. She wants to stay involved as a volunteer at WWCCR. She knows more than most how important it is that we all contribute of our time, talent and treasure, in order that the work of the Lord that has been entrusted to WWCCR will be fulfilled.



Year of Unity 2015 - The Importance of Community

God manifests the Holy Spirit's presence, not only through individual charisms and ministries, but through the witness of communited, united communities. ...We must "strive eagerly" (1 Cor. 12:31; 14:1, 12) for the charism of "community building." Visitors should witness a "unity in the Spirit" that manifests God's presence. Here are some suggestions:

- Pray together for the desire to be a community like Acts 2 that witnesses the presence of the Spirit, bringing others to Jesus Christ.
- Pray for the community-building charisms of pastoring, administration, wisdom, encouragement, hospitality, communal vision, and provide practical teaching on relationships.
- Pray for the grace to "think collectively" and "see connections," so that people do not think only of their own desires and gifts, but learn to interrelate with others and complement each other. Teach and practice the set of the section of the set of
- these in your groups.
 Have a yearly group plan that includes regular community-building activities: one-to-one sharing where people can share their background and testimony; teachings on communication skills and group dynamics; socializing together. Spend time getting to know each other and grow in spiritual bonds of dynamics; socializing together.
- triendship. Every year, teach about the importance of faith-sharing community and invite those in the Renewal who only attend events to make a greater commitment to community life.

Maturity grows when we are in committed relationships where "living the truth in love, we should grow in every way into him who is the head, Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every usporting ligament, with the proper functioning of each part, brings about the body's growth and builds itself up in love." (Eph. 4:15-16).
