# Endeavor to Lay Down Our Lives for Each Other

In his final discourse in the Upper Room, after washing the feet of his disciples, Jesus shared a message with them that he wanted them to remember. The evangelist John presents several themes. One that is very important for us in the Charismatic Renewal is the promise of the Holy Spirit. In addition,

Jesus invited the apostles and us to participate in an incredible mission, the same mission that he himself took on as he gave his life on the cross for us. Jesus says to us: "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friend" (Jn 15:13).

"Working for unity is not optional. It is a commandment from Jesus."

The National Leadership Groups of the National Catholic Charismatic Renewal in the U.S., walking our journey to the great jubilee in 2017, have

declared 2015 the "Year of Unity." One of the invitations for this year is that we are challenged to "lay down our life" for our friends. But who are our friends? Sometimes, we think of those who think, pray and talk like us as our friends. However, I want to urge us to recognize as friends all of those who have accepted Jesus Christ in their hearts and are promoting, in one way or another, baptism in the Holy Spirit and the culture of Pentecost in the modern world. However, in order to "lay down our life for others" we have to be ready to broaden our understanding of how we can do this.

The document for the Year of Unity 2015 provides us with four practical ways to live this challenge to "lay down our life":

#### PRAY TOGETHER.

One of the great gifts of the Renewal in my life is that it taught me to pray. In other words to have spontaneous conversations with God. However, through the years it's likely that our way to pray has become a routine. We might think the way that we learned to pray in the Renewal is the "right" way. When I moved from Colombia to live in the U.S., the prayer group that I began to attend was predominantly for people from Mexico. At the beginning, praying with this group was very difficult for me because the songs and the style of prayers were very different from those to which I was accustomed. Over time, I learned not only to appreciate their method of prayer,

## From Sue's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I hope you had an opportunity to experience some of the many appearances of Pope Francis while he was here in the U.S. I believe he is being led through the Holy Spirit, to bring all people to the truth of what love truly looks like and sounds like. He is speaking in a way that draws all people in, so that they are listening when He speaks the truth of the Gospel. If he led with hot topics and turned people off, they wouldn't be listening when he speaks of the love that everyone is created to be attracted to. In Pope Francis' final homily he exhorts us:

"Would that we could all be prophets! Would that all of us could be open to miracles of love for the sake of all the families of the world, and thus overcome the scandal of a narrow, petty love, closed in on itself, impatient of others!"

Let us ask the Holy Spirit to remind us of these words as we deal with our family and friends during this time of confusion and division. Let us be open to the miracles of love. Speaking about "miracles of love," on October 9 we sponsored a "Mass with Prayers for Healing and

Empowerment" at Mary Queen of Peace in Sammamish. Many families came forward together for prayer. I will try to paint a word picture for you. After the parish priest had spoken to them, a family put their arms around one another in a semicircle and he put his arms around them in prayer to complete the circle. It was a beautiful, beautiful image of healing and a communion of persons. The power of the Spirit was written all over their faces and in their tears. God has a wonderful plan for saving the family. We will continue to offer opportunities for God to touch His people in powerful ways through His Spirit!

In closing I will share another message from the final homily in Philadelphia:

"Pointedly, yet affectionately, Jesus tells us: "If you, who are evil, know

how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Lk 11:13). How much wisdom there is in these few words! It is true that, as far as goodness and purity of heart are concerned, we human beings don't have much to show! But Jesus knows that, where children are concerned, we are capable of boundless generosity. So he reassures us: if only we have faith, (as a child) the Father will give us his Spirit."

Please join me in sharing with others what Jesus says about **asking** for the Holy Spirit in Luke 11:13. Share your personal experience about how the Spirit has led you into a loving relationship with the Father and the Son. Keep scripture in your heart so that the Spirit can use it to evangelize in you. Every day let us pray with the faith of a child: "Come, Holy Spirit."

but I grew to love to pray in this new way. I am Hispanic and I love to pray in Spanish, but I also enjoy attending English services and experiencing the way the Holy Spirit moves there. We need to pray together for unity.

# BE CLEAR IN YOUR VISION FOR A UNIFIED BODY OF BELIEVERS CELEBRATING THE COMMONALITY OF ALL.

No matter our culture, language or expressions of spirituality, we all share the gift of baptism in the Holy Spirit. For this reason, we are signing a Covenant of Understanding this year, recognizing that while we have experienced baptism in the Holy Spirit, we are also invited to share this gift with the whole Church, as Pope Francis invited us to do in his talk at the Olympic Stadium in Rome last June.

# BE OPEN AND VOCAL ABOUT THE GIFT EACH GROUP BRINGS TO THE RENEWAL OF THE CHURCH.

Traveling in several states, Canada, and countries in Latin America, I have found that the Holy Spirit gives charisms in some places in particular ways. I have seen some countries in which many leaders are anointed with the gift of preaching, while in other countries the gift of healing seems to be very common. Some cultures are more inclined to worship and praise, and others to adoration. We have to recognize and rejoice in what the Holy Spirit is doing in diverse ways with his servants. We need to avoid any kind of jealousy or competition, as we are called to work in unity in order to bring many people to an encounter with Jesus.

# COMMIT TO ONGOING COMMUNICATION AND COOPERATION WITH THE DIFFERENT GROUPS.

In Romans we are told, "So we, who are many, are one body in Christ" (Rom 12:5). Very often we are too worried about what others are doing in the Renewal. Why do they worship in the way that they do? Who has the largest evangelistic event? Who has more people in their communities? Why are they doing a Life in the Spirit seminar? We are called right now to a time of maturity in the Renewal. One way to show this maturity is by working in unity. Sometimes we spend too much time gossiping and judging others. Today, in this Year of Unity, we are called to work together. We need to unite and use all of our charisms to continue to build the Body of Christ. This is an urgent matter for evangelization. The Church hopes that the Renewal is able to help people fall in love with Jesus and receive the empowerment of the Holy Spirit. We need to be in communication with our brothers and sisters from various expressions of the Renewal in order to work together to this end. In addition to organizing events, we must also create processes in which everyone is included independent of culture, ethnicity or language background. We are called to live as a people of a New Pentecost – not as a people of the Tower of Babel!

For me, the Charismatic Renewal is a lifestyle, a call to live as Jesus lived, filled with the Holy Spirit and devoting our lives to the service of the Father. Working for unity is not optional. It is a commandment from Jesus. Today, every person who has experienced baptism in the Holy Spirit is invited to enter the Upper Room, the same place of Pentecost, and remember his words. And so we ask the Holy Spirit to give us the grace to give up our agendas and work only for the plans that God has for the Renewal. We are called to listen, respect and collaborate with our brothers and sisters to build the culture of Pentecost.




