A New Pentecost for the New Evangelization

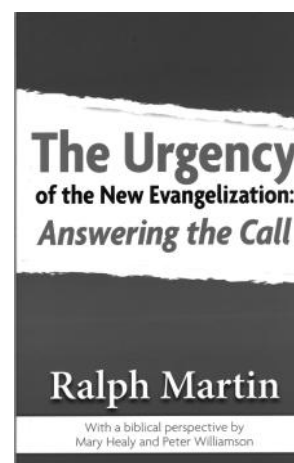
I love the writings of Pope Paul VI. A quote that often inspires me is “Evangelization will never be possible without the action of the Holy Spirit” (Evangelii Nuntiandi, 75). I think this is why I love being involved with Catholic Charismatic Renewal, because the purpose of the Renewal is that people would come into a personal relationship with Jesus, empowered by the Holy Spirit, to the Glory of God the Father! It is this relationship that empowers us for evangelization. What an exciting mission!

Reading the documents of the Church and our recent Church history, phrases like “the new evangelization” and “new Pentecost” will be familiar. Pope John XXIII opened the Vatican II Council with this prayer: “*O Divine Spirit, renew your wonders in this our day as by a new Pentecost.*” Since 1983, Pope John Paul II began to talk about the need for a “new evangelization” and others have taken up the call, reflecting on how to proclaim the Good News in each new decade. In more recent history Pope Benedict XVI brought together the Bishops for a Synod on The New Evangelization for the Transmission of the Christian Faith in October 2012 (*if you have a chance read the Lineamente and the Propositions from the Synod*).

For many people, these phrases might seem daunting or they might even think “what does that have to do with me in my daily life?” I think that’s why I was so excited as I recently read Ralph Martin’s book: “*The Urgency of the New Evangelization: Answering the Call.*” This book is very easy to read, not very long, and draws together the writings of our recent popes and scripture, connecting baptism in the Holy Spirit with our call to proclaim the Kingdom of God and what is at stake if we do not. Here are a few highlights and quotes from this book:

What is the New Evangelization?

“Starting in 1983 Pope John Paul II began to frequently call for a ‘new evangelization.’ He made it clear he wasn’t calling for a new gospel, but a new effort, characterized by new ‘ardor, methods, and expression.’ And directed in a new way, not only to those who have never heard the gospel before...but now also to the lukewarm and de-Christianized traditionally Christian Western nations” (p. 13).

New Evangelization *continued*

“To state it in a simple way, what’s primarily new about the ‘new evangelization’ is whom it is directed toward, the baptized who are not living in an active relationship of discipleship with Jesus” (p. 14).

Why Bother?

“Of course, what evangelization is all about is inviting people to believe and repent and leave the wide path and set out on the narrow path that is so true, good, and blessed, the path that turns out to be Jesus himself” (p. 25).

“It is clearly not enough simply to be baptized, or even go to Church, to be saved: what is necessary is the faith that leads to obedience, to discipleship” (p. 28).

“Why bother to evangelize? Because the eternal destinies – heaven or hell – of many millions of our fellow Catholics, not to mention, many millions of countless others, are hanging in the balance. Christianity is not just an optional enrichment possibility for human life – but a message that truly is a matter of life or death, heaven or hell” (p. 28).

Our Role in the New Evangelization

“But as the Scripture indicates, and common sense reveals, there is no way that the mission of the Church can succeed without every baptized Catholic taking an active role” (p. 29).

“What is being called for and what is necessary is evangelization becoming part of the baptized Catholic’s fundamental identity and part of their everyday way of life” (p. 31).

“Even for those who are considered ‘devout’ Catholics, a real conversion is needed, to seeing themselves not just as concerned with their own holiness and works of Christian service but

consumed with a passion to share Christ with others” (p. 36).

“May our ‘yes’ to the call to holiness and to the call of evangelization, be ever deeper and may the life of Christ shine forth from our faces and the face of the Church so that as many as possible might be saved!

“For this, of course, a ‘new Pentecost’ is needed, appropriated on a personal level” (p. 36).

A New Pentecost for the New Evangelization

“From the prayer of Pope John XXIII for the [Vatican II] Council, asking God to send us a ‘new Pentecost,’ through Pope Benedict XVI’s call for prayer for a renewal of Baptism and Confirmation, the ‘baptism in the Spirit,’ the popes have strongly emphasized the need the Church and each of us has to experience today the work of the Spirit as described in the Acts of the Apostles” (p. 37).

“Whenever the Spirit intervenes, he leaves people astonished. He brings about events of amazing newness; he radically changes persons and history” (*JPII, Pentecost Vigil 1998* – p. 40).

“Pope Benedict XVI has not only called for a ‘renewed Pentecost’ but has called for a ‘culture of Pentecost’ to be established in the Church. He also frequently identifies the mission of Jesus as to ‘baptize in the Holy Spirit’ ” (p. 43).

“ ‘Baptism in the Spirit’ is the main terminology used in North America to describe an experience of the Spirit that is often accompanied by a deeper personal encounter with Christ. It is characterized by a glimpse of his Lordship and an experience of the Father’s love that is personal and deeply liberating. And it evokes a new

awareness that we are truly not orphans but that the Holy Spirit is truly present and ready to encourage, convict, guide, and help us understand the things of God” (p. 46-47).

What is the Message?

“Believing or not believing, responding to the Father’s love or not responding, has eternal consequences. This is why it matters so much that we respond to the call to evangelization. The eternal destinies of people we love are at stake” (p. 57).

There is so much more to this book than I could even put in this article. I hope these few quotes will inspire you! The appendix provided by Mary Healy and Peter Williamson gives a biblical perspective on this topic and is an invaluable resource. I highly recommend reading this book (*it is available to order through the WWCCR bookstore*).

In response to this continued call to a New Pentecost for the New Evangelization, the WWCCR Prayer Group and Leadership Development Committee is brainstorming ways to spread this grace through the ministry of WWCCR. See page 4 for an invitation to find out more.

Please, join me in this prayer for the sake of all those we love:

“Lord, I want more of your Holy Spirit. Activate aspects of His work that have been dormant in my life. Bring me into a deeper relationship with you. Give me greater zeal to be a witness for you and live a life of prayer, love, and service. Pour out your Holy Spirit on the whole Church! We need you, Lord! Come!” (p. 55)

POPE FRANCIS SPEAKS TO THE RENEWAL

An excerpt from a speech to the Italian Renewal in the Spirit (and to all of us) on June 1, 2014

This is your path: *evangelization, spiritual ecumenism, caring for the poor and needy, and welcoming the marginalized.* And all of it is based on worship! The foundation of the renewal is worshipping God!

They asked me to tell you what the Pope expects of you.

The first thing is **conversion to the love of Jesus** which changes our lives and makes each Christian a witness to God's love. The Church expects this witness of Christian life from us, and the Holy Spirit helps us to live the Gospel fully and consistently for our own growth in holiness.

I expect you to share with everyone in the Church **the grace of baptism in the Holy Spirit** (*a phrase we find in the Acts of the Apostles*).

I expect you to **evangelize with the word of God**, which proclaims that Jesus lives and that he loves all men and women.

To **give a witness of spiritual ecumenism** to all our brothers and sisters of other Churches and Christian communities who believe in Jesus as Lord and Saviour.

To **remain united** in the love that the Lord Jesus asks us to have for all people, and in prayer to the Holy Spirit for the attainment of this **unity** which is necessary for evangelization in the name of Jesus. Remember that "the charismatic renewal is *de facto* ecumenical in nature ... The Catholic renewal rejoices in what the Holy Spirit is accomplishing in the other Churches" (1 Malines 5,3).

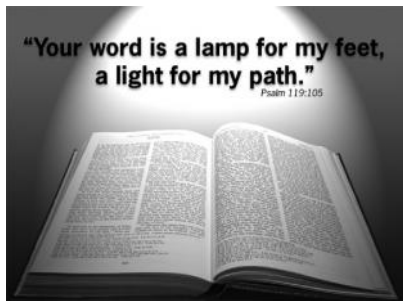
