

YOU ARE INVITED

These three important words can lead to a life-changing event. How often have we accepted an invitation that turned out to be life-changing for us? We listened to someone tell how Jesus became real to them, and we desired that for ourselves. And how often have we extended an invitation to someone that became an encounter with Jesus that changed their lives? Invitations are really all around us: ubiquitous advertising, appeals inviting us to participate and donate, casual words saying that we must keep in touch, both email and postal invitations to celebrations; all part of the fabric of our lives. But those that can lead to an encounter with Jesus Christ are the most valued of all.

WWCCR has issued many invitations over the past 40 plus years that always present Jesus, that encourage participants to have a personal relationship with him that will change their lives forever. Two of those events were held this last May: A Holy Spirit Retreat on May 4 at St. Thomas parish, Tukwila, and a Mass in preparation for Pentecost on May 11 at St. Pius X parish, Mountlake Terrace. Both began with invitations through emails, bulletins, and personal words. Many people brought others with them.

Twenty seven people accepted the invitation to come to the Holy Spirit Retreat at St. Thomas parish. The presentations, testimonies and prayer all led to participants opening their hearts to an outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Sometimes before we can invite a friend to a special event, we must build a relationship that includes words of encouragement. The gift of encouragement can open the hearts of people because it gives them a hopeful

view, it builds them up. Establishing a good relationship with another is laying the foundation of trust and love that we need to become open to a deeper experience of the love of God through the Holy Spirit.

Another gift we can use is the gift of faith, to step out in faith with an invitation to someone where they will hear the gospel. We extend the invitation believing that the Lord can use the occasion to touch them with his love. God will answer our prayers for those we invite, even though we might think our prayers and invitations are not working. Our faith is in God, not in ourselves. If we sinners know how to give good gifts to others, how much more will the Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask? (Luke 11:13)

"You are invited." Three important words that can change a life, maybe our own. Paying attention to invitations, discerning whether they are of the Holy Spirit, praying for guidance, these are all elements that help us be led by the Spirit to "walk in the works God has prepared for us beforehand." (Ephesians 2:10).

Someone recalled that one of the Word Gifts at our Mass of Preparation for Pentecost included "invite," and thus "invite" became the theme for this month's Gleanings. Articles were then assigned. The transcription of the video of the Word Gifts that were given during that Mass showed that all of them, not just one, reflected "invitation." The Holy Spirit was guiding us. We use our charismatic gifts of encouragement and faith to pass on these invitations to others. 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INVITATION AND STRUGGLE

Invitation is important. When you experience a personal relationship with Jesus, you naturally want others to know him too. A friend of mine has been inviting people to WWCCR events for the last few months and not one person has come with him to an event. I once printed 100 youth retreat brochures and took them to my parish youth group. I was so excited to share about the next retreat coming up. I stood at the door and handed them all out and at the end there were 90 flyers left on the floor. Not everyone will accept your invitation.

Every invitation should start with prayer. Lord, who do you want me to invite? Pray and seek the Lord about how to ask. The Lord already knows who is ready to accept an invitation, so he might direct you to the least expected person. Often if someone is facing illness or other challenges, they may be ready to try anything to find comfort.

Remember the story of the king who invited people to his wedding and no one came? (Matthew 22:9-11) He sent his servants out to invite people from the "highways and byways" to bring in strangers. Some strangers are more open to our invitation. Strangers are everywhere: sitting next to you at Mass, in front of you in line to buy coffee or groceries, or even at a school PTA meeting. When you start praying for who to invite, your view of who to invite will grow and probably include strangers.

The Lord may have a different planned outcome all together. Even unanswered invitations don't have to be disappointments. When you stay rooted in your relationship with Jesus, grounded in prayer and scripture, and connected to community, God can even use your disappointment to help you draw closer to him.

Never give up! Step outside your comfort zone and keep sharing your excitement about what the Holy Spirit is doing in your life. Patiently stay in relationship with people who need an invitation to know Jesus. Then the Lord can use your evangelistic courage to develop new gifts of confidence and wisdom in your life. Your own spiritual life can grow as you continue to daily trust the Lord and invite others into their own relationship with Jesus.

INVITATION: a: the act of inviting. b: an often formal request to be present or participate.

I was recently reminded of the importance of Invitation.

This past May a few prayer warriors were invited to help at a retreat of thirty University of Washington undergrads for their Spring spiritual retreat. Newman Center director, Fr. Marcin Szymanski, O.P. had asked us to come Saturday evening to pray with these young men and women. We've helped in the past, so I thought we were prepared. Of course I misunderstood a slight, minor detail in the invite. As my friend Catherine and I were driving up the foothills my GPS took us to a campsite. By a river. This must be a mistake, I said to my friend. Where's the Lodge? The indoor fireplace? The bathrooms!! We definitely were not dressed for this place. It was a rainy cold day with only a canopy to keep us dry. Yikes! It had been a very busy couple of months so I probably didn't look close enough at the invitation, because to be honest with you, if I had known where it was, I would never have said yes. I know what you're thinking. What a bad attitude, Drea! Well, you're right.

My friend wisely encouraged me to pray the Divine Mercy chaplet with her as she could probably see the steam coming out of my ears. I was more embarrassed at my mistake. In the car as my feet began to thaw, so did my attitude. With each "For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world" I began to see that this was not a mistake. It was an invitation to truly be "present." How blessed we were to "participate" and pray for these young men and women in their deepest need.

If I would have said no to this invitation, we would have missed out in seeing the joy, freedom and gratitude on the faces of these young men and women when we left. This experience helped me to have the best "attitude adjustment" to date. Oh, and we can now say that we've done prayer ministry via car for college Catholics! I can laugh about it now.

REFLECTION. Can you recall a time you needed a spiritual attitude adjustment?

ACTION. For heaven's sake, invite someone to participate in something uplifting! It might just change their life.
