

RESPONDING TO THE HOLY SPIRIT'S CALL

A Testimony by Ruth Ashburn

I attended the "Life With The Holy Spirit" retreat sponsored by WWCCR on June 29th at St. Hubert's in Langley, Whidbey Island. A great prayer team guided our group to let go of our cares, really trust in what God wants to reveal to us, and be open to what gifts/charisms he is happy to give to us, if we but ask and are receptive to his call. At the end of the retreat, members of the WWCCR team prayed over those who wanted prayer for a specific healing or being open to the charisms the Lord wants to give us. I've been discerning about asking for the gift of healing so I felt it was time to pray for this specifically. I didn't "feel" any differently afterward but came away with a sense of peace, joyful anticipation of how the Spirit would lead me in the days ahead, and emotional after spending the day with so many faithful people.

Two weeks later I really felt the Holy Spirit moving in me. A motorcycle/pickup truck accident happened right on the corner of our property. My husband ran to our bedroom asking me what I had dropped and then we both realized it was actually the collision we heard! I instinctively grabbed my "spiritual" bag of Miraculous Medals/St.

Benedict Medals and ran outside not thinking about what I'd find but knowing I needed to give out my packets of medals to whoever was involved.

By the time I got there, several people had stopped and the injured motorcyclist was lying on the grass, conscious but very dazed with injuries to his legs and feet. A few people were there helping him until the EMTs arrived. I crouched beside him and asked if I could give him a medal packet for protection from the Blessed Mother. At first he said "No, I don't need...wait, yes please I want them." I was able to put a packet in his hand and after a minute or two, stood up assessing the scene. At that moment two women ran up to me praising God that there was someone else of faith there to minister to him and asked to pray with me for the man. We embraced in a tight circle and prayed for him. After our prayer I offered both women a packet of medals which they took gratefully. The driver of the pickup was standing near us in a daze as to how it all happened, so I went to him and asked if I could pray with him which he agreed to without hesitating, saying he was a man of faith too. He also was grateful to receive a medal packet. At that time a woman drove up fast and frantically got out of her car screaming "Where is my husband? Where is my husband?" She was only told her husband was in a motorcycle accident and didn't know what she was going to find when she got there. She rushed to her husband's side, sobbing hysterically, but after seeing he was conscious and able to talk, was able to calm down a bit. I went over to her and asked her if she would like a medal packet also and she immediately

I was excited to register for the Eucharistic
Congress held at Lucas Oil Stadium, Indianapolis, July 18, 2024. Love for the Eucharist was
the main gift of the Holy Spirit that I received
when I was baptized in the Spirit. The belief
that Jesus was truly present in that wafer of bread:
body, blood, soul and divinity, filled my whole being,
was no longer just head knowledge. I had to go to this Congress. And to
have the Congress just one hour away from where my brother lived was
even more special. But then, at my brother's, I got Covid, and could not
attend the sessions.

Sue Gallwas, former Executive Director of WWCCR, was able to attend the Eucharistic Congress. "Heaven", she said, "was the word I would describe for 50,000 Catholics in one place, adoring and worshiping the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, kneeling in silence for an hour. 'On earth as it is in heaven.' One heart, one mind, one Body in Christ! All singing a cappella. Amazing! When I received the Eucharist, it was like a party going on in my heart! There were so many priests and bishops that it took over thirty minutes for them to process in. One, Holy, Apostolic!"

Archbishop Charles Thompson of Indianapolis gave this prayer: "We pray for a greater outpouring of your Spirit that we might come to know and love Our Lord Jesus even more as he gives himself always in the Holy Eucharist and to share that gift with all those we meet. We ask this through Jesus Christ Our Lord."

said "Yes, thank you so much!" By this time the EMTs and police had arrived, so people began to leave knowing the situation was being handled. A few days later one of the women I prayed with at the accident recognized me in the grocery store and once again thanked me for handing out the medal packets and praying with her at the accident; it turns out she is a neighbor of the injured man who lives just a mile down the road from us. She was happy to report the injured man was doing better; he had a broken foot and many lacerations but no other major injuries. She also told me that both he and his wife wear the medals every day!

As I reflect back on what happened, it feels almost like a dream. I didn't spend a moment thinking about if I should or shouldn't minister to those in need; I felt I was guided by the Holy Spirit to somehow bring a message from the Lord of healing, trust, love, & peace. I realize that the gift of healing isn't just in the physical sense but in whatever way one needs it at the time. I praise God for opening my heart to be receptive to hearing his call.




What a fun day!
