You and me. The call in this opening session was for us to live in the JOY that comes from looking at the Lord first, for as William Blake wrote, "We become what we behold."

Reflection Question: How different would my life be if I looked at God first in every situation?

Next day, with many humorous quips, Sarah presented the Saturday morning talk: Joy: An Inside



Job. It happened to be International Women's Day, and Sarah encouraged us to dwell on the image of God as a gentleman. She drew this from meditating on the Song of Songs. She made the scripture alive for us, saying that the Lord, wet with dew, had been knocking at the door of our hearts all night long while we were sleeping! Pondering this image will deepen our awareness of our

identity as beloved daughters of the King. Sarah reminded us that the Lord wants to be a full-time resident in our hearts—not just a guest. As in the Garden, God calls out to us, "Where are you?" We don't have to hide in shame because everything in our lives comes under the gaze of his love;

this makes it easier for us to be reconciled to our particular histories, not letting anything from the past be an obstacle to our living an intimate relationship of love with our God.

Reflection Question: Are there areas of shame in my heart that God wants to smother in mercy?

We gathered together again late Saturday afternoon for session three: Can't Keep It for Yourself. We were all amazed to learn just how powerful a praying woman can be for the world as we heard the story of the Hebrides Revival in the 1950's: two elderly women committed to praying for young people brought about an intense revival. This encouraged us, regardless of age, to pray for our young people. And finally, Sarah reminded us of the Tent of Meeting in Exodus 33, where Moses would meet with God and talk with him as a friend would. This Tent was a retreat highlight for me: I googled an image of the Tent of Meeting, and I go into that tent in my imagination twice a day,

to spend time with God as his friend, and to listen.

Reflection Question: How might Jesus be calling me to share his joy with those I encounter in everyday life?

The retreat ended on a high note with

Sunday morning Mass. Our faces radiant, we left the retreat and headed home to our various spheres: ready to champion other women; ready to radiate joy to others; ready to gaze at the Lord first; ready to give the Lord permanent residency in our hearts; ready to pray for youth; and ready to be the Lord's modern Perpetuas and Felicitys in our time.
